



CFI REPORT

GLENN MARTIN

1) WE continue to have incidents where club members do not prepare before arriving at an airfield that they are unfamiliar with.

Being prepared!

On Sunday 8 October several club members flew to Forest Field for the 35th celebrations.

Unfortunately, although FF is a local field and many of our members fly there regularly, a number of our pilots did not review the plate before going and caused significant disruption by not joining correctly, joining for a "right hand circuit" although FF is all left hand and turning right after take-off. One member even "got lost" and returned to RT even though FF is only 10 miles!

This is very disappointing. It is unsafe and reflects poorly on our club and on all microlight Pilots. FF is a private airfield and the owners have generously allowed CRAC Instructors and members to use this field for practice for many years... this threatens the access we have to FF.

The fact that a number of GA Pilots also mucked this up does not absolve us from being professional.

People just saying "I have plenty of tech in the cockpit and just go" is far below any standard required. As certified pilots we are required and expected to be prepared for the flight we are contemplating. Just going into a place you are not very familiar with is not the way, even with familiar fields we always need to check the NOTAMS

The *Club approved Instructors* have the skill, professionalism, and willingness to work with anyone and educate them to the standard. Take the opportunity of using the expertise around us to become a better and safer pilot.

The airfield plate should be reviewed and understood, these do change, and the NOTAMs checked as a bare minimum. Should you be unfamiliar with a field talk to someone, take a knowledgeable passenger etc.

To be clear, the standard procedure approaching a field are encapsulated in the two common acronyms.

ABREIFS:

ATIS set

Brief plate and NOTAMS

Radio frequency set and call as required

Engine T's and P's

Instruments set

Fuel-sufficient/fullest tank

Secure all items

Approach/departure **TCTWO**:

Threats

Charts briefed

Terrain

Weather

Operational (i.e., NOTAMS)


- 2) We have had two club fly aways this month to Lake Station and to Paraparaumu I developed and presented the preflight briefings for these.
- 3) RAANZ are looking at a subsidy for 50% of the cost of the Flight Instructors Guides for the Club Instructors. Scott can give an update on the progress.
- 5) The Tecnam "fix" for the undercarriage of RGE has arrived and I expect will be completed soon
- 6) An Instructors Meeting was held on 18 October. The main topic was a SOP for use when training in the club Savannah. In addition, Controlled Airspace training and Bombing competition were also discussed.
- 7) Lionel/ Colin and I held a Controlled airspace seminar on the 18 October the highlight was Colin being an ATC controller on a "radio" actually intercom everyone felt this was very useful and it is highly recommended that we do this again.
- 8) RAANZ has updated their Exam system, this looks much better and far more professional. I have used

this for one student so far and it is a bit flaky. However, the new system *needs a good Internet connection.* This now makes an upgrade for CRAC a higher priority.

Starlink was installed by Scott/Buzz ?? and a Wi-Fi repeated installed. This has resulted in an increase

from 20mbit/s to 135 in the kitchen and to 270 in the Instructors Office.

There were considerable problems getting them to work in NZ, but that is now all sorted out. As a result of this process Microair made us a NZ Dealer for their products.

Many microlite owners and some certified aircraft owners will have the old unmodified units on the shelf gathering dust. I would like to get the info out there that these Transponders still retain some value.


Got to Paraparaumu and borrowed a phone to call Angus, my son. When he got to the airport he said "we will find it". Modern Generation Z!

OCTOBER-NOVEMBER-DECEMBER 2023

- Flight hours down significantly
- CFI: Some issues with incorrect circuits flown at NZFF (see report)
- Fire extinguishers tested
- Christmas party planned, awards to be re-instituted
- ATC Flying day planned before Christmas (subsequently cancelled due to weather)
- Timothy Ward appointed Treasurer understudy, potential to replace Scott James at next AGM
- New bank account being created
- 3 new fuel cards obtained for club aircraft use
- Training syllabus for new Club Savannah outlined by CFI. Three levels of training offered, from basic typerating through to off-field landings.
- RGE Undercarriage fix still a work in progress interpretations over the "approved alternative" composite repair causing issues.
- EFTPOS considered for tuck shop but too expensive given the turnover
- Working bee to be organised to fix the sign on the Oxford Road/Mertons Road intersection – new year
- First Solo certificates to be presented at the Christmas Party
- Fuelling situation: decisions made at special committee meeting on field were ratified at next committee meeting. Pneumatic pump to be connected and the current fuel trailer used to directly fill club aircraft. Instructors to be trained, and the process documented in writing. Club members will be allowed to fill Club aircraft once they have been trained.
- Christmas function set at \$30 per person. 70 people expected, volunteers requested for a hangar tidy-up on November 17th.
- Club Savannah progress going well, aircraft expected to be online around the Christmas period.
- Emergency Contacts (NoK) system to be upgraded
- Discussions between CFI and AMC regarding Aircraft maintenance, specifically the fix for RGE and other issues. AMC subsequently resigned from the role.
- Aircraft options due to lack of flying hours discussed, with the possibility of one or more aircraft being sold, mothballed, or leased. To be discussed in full in February.
